Security Update

Our security update this month comes from the Edmonton Police Service and explains the difference between the emergency and non-emergency lines.

When to call the emergency line

Call 911 if a crime is in progress or the situation is life threatening. The operator will determine if you need police, fire, or an ambulance.

If you accidentally call 911, don't hang up! Stay on the line and let the operator know you don't need assistance so they know your call doesn't require a response.

When to call the non-emergency line

Call #377 from a cellphone or (780) 423-4567 if your situation doesn't require an immediate response. This includes suspicious persons, stolen vehicles, or thefts over \$5,000. You can also call if you need advice on how to proceed with reporting a crime or have other general policing questions.
